Diverse Group Gathers at the World Bank for Developing a Coordinated Strategy for Addressing a Comprehensive Education Agenda in Africa

WASHINGTON—In Fall 2008, The World Bank Group-IMF African Society, Leadership Africa USA (LA USA) and the International Foundation for Education and Self-Help co-sponsored as part of the Constituency for Africa's Ronald H. Brown Series. The workshop focused on "Developing a Coordinated Strategy for Addressing a Comprehensive Education Agenda in Africa." An expert group of panelists in the Non-Governmental, Multi-lateral Development Bank and Private Sectors provided perspectives on developing such a strategy.

Some of the recommendations raised by both panelists and participants included a need to:

- examine post-primary education reform;
- continue to recognize the importance of gender equity;
- support African regional institutions;
- focus on smart and efficient development assistance.
